Travel Checklist:

Gather up these important travel documents before you leave for Canada:

- Update, renew or apply for a passport (Please note: If possible, you should renew your passport <u>9 months</u> before it expires. You may have problems entering Canada if your passport expires within 6 months of travel date.);
- Obtain a Visa if it is required;
- Print out this <u>Canadian customs letter of recognition</u> to travel with and present when arriving at customs in Vancouver;
- Print out this GSA invitation letter of support to travel with and present when arriving at customs in Vancouver;
- Copy down the physical address of where you will be staying in Vancouver during the conference; and
- Be aware that customs officers may ask you if you have enough money for both your stay in Canada and for your return home.
